# DIRECTOR'S NOTE

As a child, I was a huge fan of female pop supergroup The Go-Go's, and their catchy tunes provided much of the soundtrack of the 1980s. Back then, there weren't many all-female bands, and the fact that the talented women who made up The Go-Go's--lead singer Belinda Carlisle, backed by Charlotte Caffey on lead guitar and keyboards, Gina Schock on drums, Kathy Valentine on bass and Jane Wiedlin on rhythm guitar--wrote their own music and played their own instruments, was truly radical at the time. The Go-Go's, who were inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 2021, are generally considered the best all-female rock band of all time – and one of the best rock bands, period.

It is, perhaps, unsurprising, then, that the music of The Go-Go's joined many other artists' pop catalogues in becoming the basis for a Broadway musical. The creators of *Head Over Heels*, named for one the group's biggest hits, did not, however, simply settle for a jukebox musical with a tenuous storyline, but instead opted to musicalize Sir Phillip Sydney's 1593 series of poems, *The Countess of Pembroke's Arcadia*, using the songs of The Go-Go's. The result is the fun but complicated, dance-driven musical that premiered at the Oregon Shakespeare Festival in 2015 and went to Broadway in 2018 for a brief run of 164 performances. It is most remembered for its character Pythio, the first non-binary character in a Broadway musical, who was played by Peppermint, the first transgender woman to create a Broadway role.

Our Lafayette production of *Head Over Heels* features a talented cast who fearlessly take on the show's challenges, ranging from the period language borrowed from Sir Phillip Sydney to the Shakespeare-style plot, to the complex portrayals of gender and intense and exhausting dance demands of the production. Excel scholar Christie Chahwan, who is assisting the department this season as a choreographer, has been a vital force on the production, and has had a clear vision and it was a pleasure to collaborate with her on this show. I am delighted to welcome two new collaborators to our creative team for this project. New Lafayette Assistant Professor of Theater Jake Salgado has created a delightful set and props for his first of many Lafayette productions and he's successfully managed to craft a "fairy tale meets the 1980s" world. Musical Director, accompanist and conductor Mitch Samu brings his years of professional experience and expertise to the musical moments in the show. Returning lighting designer Kia Rogers once again has illuminated this magical world beautifully, and Erin Hopwood's costumes, hair and makeup designs truly capture the dual worlds of this 1980s/fairy tale project. Intimacy director and fight choreographer Jacqueline Holloway has helped create safe combat and respectful intimate moments for our company, while technical director Alex Owens has created a massive and complex set and worked magic with his mostly student crew.

We welcome you to the show, encourage you to join us often for our theatrical endeavors "down the hill," and hope that, like the characters in *Head Over Heels*, you always manage to keep "the beat" and to embrace your truest self.
