DIRECTORS NOTE

Shortly after I first started teaching at Lafayette College, some new friends who also taught in the English Department (the Theater Program at that time was part of the English Department) suggested that we start a Book Club. I had heard of Book Clubs, of course, but had never been part of one. Oprah Winfrey had launched her Book Club on her show back in 1996, but my own Club didn't form until 2006/2007.

I was part of the group for many years, running it most of the time, and I encountered many novels I now dearly love with my group of campus colleagues turned friends. While circumstances have changed and kids, and then the pandemic, shifted my ability to keep up with the books or the meetings, my Book Club holds a special place in my heart.

The Book Club Play is the latest in a long string of plays and musicals I've been able to do at Lafayette which allow me to showcase my deep love of reading and books. I've directed Little Women, Pride and Prejudice and Into the Woods, among others, all which brought to life on stage some of the best stories ever told. The Book Club Play is about books, too, but it is also

about the people who love books, and it is truly a love letter to those who often find themselves lost in a good book. I have thoroughly enjoyed working on this hilarious play with the students - we even created our own Book Club and tried to tackle *The Age of Innocence* as a group, though, in a moment where real life mirrored the play, many of us just didn't find time to read it!

Book Clubs have been around for far longer than you might think. A blog on "The Radical History of Book Clubs" notes that in 1634, in what might have been the first book club, "Anne Hutchinson, who was aboard a ship on its way to the Massachusetts Bay Colony, organized a women's group with the goal of examining and discussing the weekly sermons."* Perhaps playwright Karen Zacarías, the Mexican-American playwright whose popularity has exploded in the last few years with hits like The Book Club Play and Native Gardens, was paying homage to Anne Hutchison with the character of Ana Smith, the type A organizer of the play's Book Club (a woman with whom I find I have, perhaps, too much in common).

The Book Club Play has been a joy to work on, and has allowed me to work

with wonderful collaborators, old and new. Katrina Miller joins us as set designer for the first time, after working previously with Lafayette on a number of productions in other capacities, and has created a beautiful home for Ana and Rob, and for the play. Erin Hopwood has returned to create the show's vibrant costumes, and Lafayette regular Kia Rogers has illuminated the complicated world of the play. As always, Technical Director Alex Owens has guided his students through crafting the set (and has created the projections and sound designs), is supervising the return of our Theater and Engineering Fellows, advanced students Maddie Perry and Lily Groff, who were charged with creating the centerpiece of the set: the gorgeous

rolling library ladder. This is a surprisingly complex show, and Stage Manager Sebastiano Riverso, supported by Assistant Stage Manager Kate Stadler, has risen to the unique challenge of managing the very extensive collection of props featured in the show, while Assistant Director Liu has ably stepped in to help with any challenge that arose in rehearsal.

I hope you enjoy The Book Club Play. I also hope you too can find the joy and pleasure of losing yourself in a good book. Books truly can change your life.
