
PRODUCTION NOTE

"Finale" – the Company

Bright Star is a beautiful musical, filled with love and romance, but also tragedy, heartbreak, redemption and forgiveness. Perhaps most surprisingly, it is based on a true story, though to tell too much of the real story here would spoil the play. (Still, the true story of the Iron Mountain Baby, William Moses Gould Helms, who was born in 1902, is worth reading about after the show.) In 2016, the musical premiered on Broadway, after finding its roots in a 2013 song called "Sarah Jane and the Iron Mountain Baby," written by Steve Martin and Edie Brickell. If you've been watching Only Murders in the Building, you may be familiar with actor, writer and comedian Steve Martin. Martin has had an enormously successful

and comedian Steve Martin. Martin has had an enormously successful career as a comic actor and writer for decades, appearing many times in memorable Saturday Night Live episodes, and acting in hit films including Father of the Bride, Parenthood and Cheaper By the Dozen. You may be less familiar with his talents as a bluegrass musician. Martin is a GRAMMY®-winning banjo player and is responsible, along with Edie Brickell (who rose to fame in the late 1980s as the lead singer of The New Bohemians, a band with several hit songs, including 1988's "What I Am"), for Bright Star. In an unusual arrangement, they share music and story credits, while Martin crafted the book and Brickell wrote the lyrics. I first saw Bright Star during its initial Broadway run, and I went back several times after falling in love with it on my first viewing, and I am so glad to be able to bring it to Lafayette's campus now.

The Theater Department is thrilled to return to the Williams Center for the Arts for *Bright Star*, after producing our shows for the last several years down the

hill on the beautiful Arts Campus in the Weiss Theater in Buck Hall. The move up the hill for this musical has been our most complex technical challenge to date, but technical director Alexander Owens has risen to the occassion, and admirably transformed the space into a gorgeous home for the production, seemingly overnight. Our talented team of designers, including Assistant Professor of Theater Jake Salgado as set designer, returning guest lighting designer Kia Rogers, properties designer and scenic artist Katrina Miller and sound designer Matt Sheehan, along with new collaborators Will Morris as costume designer and Visiting Assistant Professor Melissa Livington as hair designer, have together crafted a beautiful and evocative world for the production, which is deeply steeped in the looks, sounds and crafts of North Carolina, past and present. We are especially pleased to have students contributing to design and technical elements of the show in meaningful ways, including Aven Lancaster as Assistant Scenic Designer, Laura Coffey as Assistant Hair Designer, and Lily Groff as Head Electrician.

We are very excited that this show features a ten-piece bluegrass band featuring six talented Lafayette students alongside four professional musicians. Musical director Mitch Samu and conductor Tom DiGiovanni have worked tirelessly to help our singers and instrumentalists master the tricky bluegrass sound, while choreographer Deena Linn has challenged our students to perform intricate choreography that reflects the two time periods the musical switches between throughout the show: the 1920s and the 1940s. Our student stage management team, lead by Kate Stadter, and assisted by Zoe Sarr, Manning Yip and Angel Yan, have been a formidable crew and have tackled the many challenges a production of this complexity has presented with ease.

Just weeks after we started rehearsing *Bright Star*, Hurricane Helene devestated Asheville, North Carolina, and many surrounding towns and states. As much of the musical is set there, our company wanted to bring some visibility to the relief efforts that have continued there since late September. We've provided links in this program to organizations providing aid to Asheville and the surrounding communities and we encourage you to visit them and support their efforts.

In the days leading up to the opening of *Bright Star*, the world changed with the 2024 US Election. I know many in our community have found these days, and the prospect of the years ahead, challenging and overwhelming. *Bright Star*, at its heart, is a story of overcoming grief and loss, and finding a way to move forward even when all hope seems lost. I have found comfort in the songs and story over the last few days, and found inspiration in the resilience of the woman at the center of the musical. Thank you for joining us at this show, and if you too are seeking solace, I leave you with the lyrics to "Sun's

Gonna Shine," from Bright Star.

You got the power. You got the faith.
You got the strength to go on.
You got the light. You got the way.
We're never all alone.
The sun is gonna shine again.


