

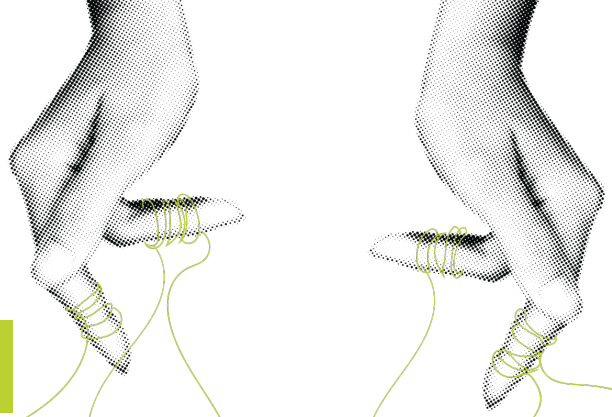

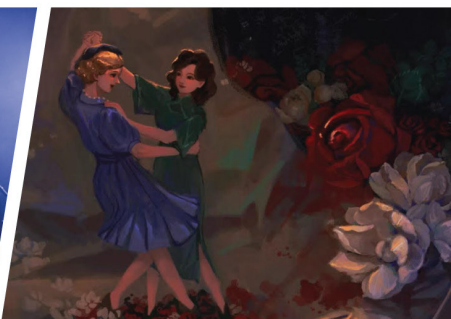

The Dagger, Joanna Howson

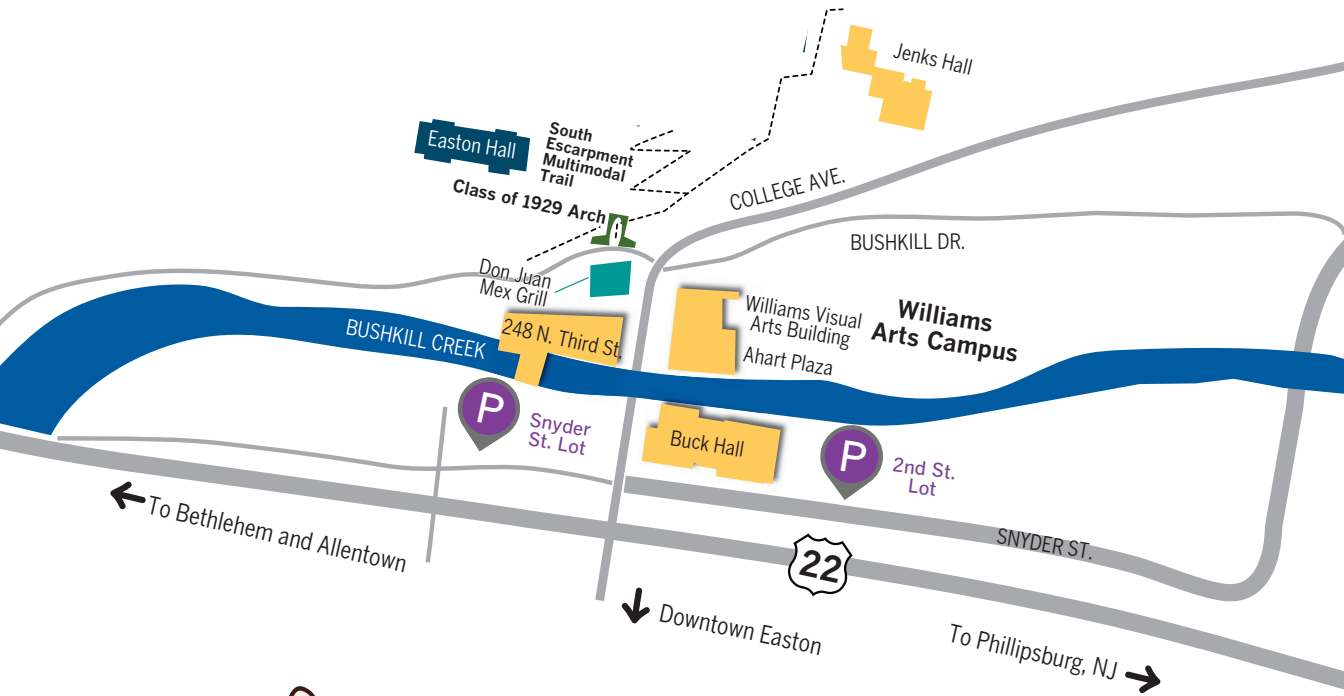
Two storylines in different time periods taking place in the same historical house and involving members of the same family.
